Pennsylvania Government

Government in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania follows the Federal model. There are 3 separate branches of government. Each of these offices are elected by the people through election.

- The Executive Branch with the Governor serving as the executive
- The Legislative Branch composed of the Senate and the House
- The Judicial Branch (the Supreme, Superior, Commonwealth, Common pleas, and magisterial courts).



Pennsylvania Governor



The Executive Branch has many key responsibilities, including managing for all state agencies and services

Signs laws passed by the General Assembly

Provides the state budget for consideration by the General Assembly



The Pennsylvania General Assembly

There are 2 chambers the Senate and the House



Writes and passes the laws Has responsibility for funding all state activities



The Pennsylvania General Assembly


The PA General Assembly (Legislature) writes and passes the laws and has key responsibility that include funding all state activities – human services, regulation, revenue collection, business regulation, and voting to name a few

A wide range of organizations – business, nonprofits, other governmental units – spend a great deal of time advocating the Legislature on issues that are important to them and their constituents

PHAN focuses resources on the Legislature on an ongoing basis. Currently, we are working on eliminating medical debt and the cost of prescription drugs.

Voting

Voting is both a right and a responsibility. This right is guaranteed in the U.S. Constitution under the 26th Amendment:

"The right of citizens of the United States, who are eighteen years of age or older, to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of age."



Voting – 2024 Elected Offices

At the Federal level, we will elect

The President and Vice President of the United States (4 year term) One of the 2 US Senators (6 year term)

At the State level, we will elect

Representatives to Congress (2 year term) State Attorney General (4 year term) Auditor General (4 year term) State Treasurer (4 year term)

Some State Senators (4 years) and all Representatives of the House (2 years)

Voter registration can also be done by using a paper Voter Registration Form available at Pennsylvania State Stores, Libraries, the offices of State Senators and State Representatives




Key Dates for the 2024 Primary Election

- April 8, 2024: Last Day to Register to Vote ~ Vote.pa.gov
- April 16, 2024: Last Day to Apply for Mail-In or Civilian Absentee Ballot
- April 23, 2024: Election Day! Polls are open from 7am to 8pm.
- April 23, 2024: Mail-in and absentee ballots must be received
