# Montco CSP Opposes Executive Order To expand involuntary treatment To address homelessness

The Montgomery County Community Support
Program (CSP) stands in strong opposition to the
recent Executive Order directing federal agencies
to expand involuntary treatment as a strategy to
address homelessness. This approach threatens to undermine
decades of progress toward recovery-oriented, person-centered
care.

Mental illness is not a public nuisance to be managed through coercion or confinement. It is a health condition that demands dignity, autonomy, and access to comprehensive, voluntary supports. While homelessness is a critical issue, conflating it with mental illness and defaulting to institutionalization ignores the evidence: housing first, peer-driven services, early intervention, and robust community-based supports are what work.

CSP is a collaboration of individuals with lived experience, family members, providers, and county leaders, all united by a commitment to recovery. We reject policies that prioritize visibility and containment over solutions. Coercion is not care. Institutions are not homes. Instead of expanding involuntary treatment, the federal government should restore and strengthen investments in Medicaid, housing, nutrition, and behavioral health services. These are the resources that uphold independence and connection, not isolation.

Montgomery County's CSP calls for policies rooted in respect, equity, and proven practices, not reactionary measures that criminalize or marginalize people living with mental health challenges.

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## Crisis and Diversion Updates

#### From the July minutes:

Anna Trout, the county's Crisis and Diversion Director, briefed the CSP Committee at its July meeting on crisis and diversion services in the county.

The county's Veterans Response Team has over 140 trained police officers throughout the county. The teams mix peer support with law enforcement and diversion and connect to social services. Police officers are veterans and receive special training to provide support to other veterans. Surrounding counties are also creating veterans response teams, Trout said.

The Mental Health Delegates, once housed by a provider agency, are now county employees. The delegates assess individuals in a crisis to ascertain if voluntary or involuntary treatment is needed. They have a 24-7 hotline to receive calls. Trout said the delegates are tracking data and understanding trends. The goal of the delegates is to make involuntary commitments rare. Sometimes they work remotely from a hospital to get closer to the people who are involved in these situations. Access Services sends Mobile Crisis to police departments to assist individuals in a crisis. Mobile crisis is supported with mental health funding. Now they have funds to also response to drug and alcohol crises.

Assistant Outpatient Treatment or AOT, was introduced in 2018 as an amendment to Mental Health Procedures Act. The amendment lowers the legal threshold for involuntary commitments. Every year the county submits a waiver to the state to opt out of the law. Four counties in Pennsylvania are trying to implement AOT. Montgomery County uses the opinions of CSPs, advocates, families and others with mental health experience to help write the waiver letter to opt out, Anna said.

Penny Johnson, the CSP Technical Assistant, said an article she read said the benefits to AOT are now found to be inconclusive. Trout said that TAC (Treatment Advocacy Center) supports AOT but data has been questionable. She encouraged people to keep an eye on the data.

"It's important to see if it's working," Trout said. "To date, we have not heard from other counties that it's been tremendous."

Regarding the new Behavioral Health Center, Trout said it is not open yet but there is a contract with a provider. There's no location or opening date. She added that the county commissioners support the center.




